Greg carefully documented every single lost day of work in emails to the gas company, and upon completion of the project took it upon himself to single-handedly put together and submit a claim for financial damages due to their extremely late installation. He then followed up diligently on it for months, finally identifying the head of claims for the State of Michigan and getting him Acknowledgement us \$46,000!
